All jobs in the healthcare sector range in terms of wages, depending on your profession. For a carer's basic salary it can start from around £20,000 but for a surgeon or doctor specialist salaries can range up to around £80,000.

Hours

The hours worked in this sector range enormously depending on the role. Some work shift patterns e.g. for doctors or nurses require working over night (night shifts).
